Intent: To prepare a summary of what transpired during EmDrill #2 and what actions should be taken with regard to preparing for and conducting the next Emergency Drill, scheduled for some time in the Spring, with the ultimate objective being to have an effective and efficient emergency comms network in order to survive any major grid-down situation.

Background:

EmDrill #1

Uhuru was started about 1.5 years ago

- conducted eEmDrill #1 on April 8, 2024 (total solar eclipse*) starting around early afternoon
- Message was relayed to Net Controller (HS)
- Net Controller successfully relayed Message to 5 other hams
- Message was then emailed to 20~ others (hams and non-hams) to relay to people in their local community
 - there was only 1 radio relay conducted in this way, in Mississauga.

EmDrill #2

The decision to conduct the second drill was made at a zoom meeting called for that purpose on December 16, 2024. It was also decided to start the drill on Thu Jan 30 2025 to run until the following week (Wed Feb 5 2025).

The timeframe was extended to a full week so that groups could conduct the local relay portion at their convenience.

An information page, containing all related content was established on the uhuru.info website: http://www.uhuru.info/emergency.html

^{*} it was learned that a government-sponsored emergency drill was going to be conducted on that day, in part to learn more about day-to-night transformation of the ionosphere so we decided we should do one as well.

EmDrill #2 was conducted in much the same way as EmDrill #1, with some changes

- the timeframe was extended to a full week, for reasons previously noted
- the kick-off was during an SDR/JS8 Workshop on Thu Jan 30
 - the workshop was partially focused on expanding the long distance network by utilizing SDR (software defined radio) and JS8 Call (a digital radio platform).
- the Net Controller selected one of the predetermined Message Statements
 - rather than being created at the start of the Drill, the Message was selected from among 3 predetermined Message Statements, namely
 - Wow. Is it ever HOT!
 - Wow. Is it ever COLD!
 - Wow. is it ever WINDY!
 - the Network Controller (NC) selected one of the Message Statements and sent it out over his radio in SK to be picked up by parties (not all hams), in different parts of South Ontario and beyond
 - Wow. Is it ever HOT!
 - 4-5 operators picked up the message on SDR/JS8 as well as 2 on HF radios (?)
 - this writer was one of the SDR/JS8 operators on the call
 - this writer then relayed the Message by email to local net controllers (LNCs) across the country (37 individuals)
 - between direct receipt and the emails, 28 communities were contacted (see Exhibit 1)
 - of the communities reached the following communities successfully relayed the Message locally
 - Burks Falls (see Exhibit 2)
 - Toronto-Scarborough (see Exhibit 3)

Recommendations:

- work to get more communities actively involved
- work to get an HF connected LNC in each community (SDR/JS8)
- recruit more hams
- help to integrate LoRa operators
- determine how to get other networks involved
 - MAGnet
 - Flipside (CB radios)
 - \circ V4F
 - International Veterans
 - satellite network
 - o other networks
- investigate antenna options for extending range
- conduct drills on a quarterly basis
 - next possible dates:
 - Thu Apr 10
 - Thu Apr 17
 - Thu Apr 24
 - Thu May 1

- Organize a Zoom Call
 - o to review Report
 - o to discuss Recommendations
 - to determine Dates for EmDrill #3

Emails from the LNC for Burks Falls:

This is just an FYI - we completed our first radio test yesterday in preparation for the National Emergency test next week.

We had an interesting finding: the smaller antenna appears to have a better range than the larger one on the GMRS channels that we tested. (GMRS7,GMRS17, and GMRS1). The other surprise was that channel GMRS1 gave us a larger range - about 10 kms from the highest point in Burk's Falls (water tower) where I was standing (AMAC09) to Albine's (AMAC01).

Also, we had better results in the morning test - probably related to the weather as it was snowing during the evening test.

We had our Emergency Radio Drill this morning. 10 members participated, 8 heard the message. The two that we not able to receive the message were well over 10 kms away from another radio. We all used the handheld radios (Baofeng) and repeated the message, this expanded our range. I think we did well:)
